
# Author Interview

When I was in primary school I loved reading a range of books but I really loved books by Roald Dahl. My favourite was the BFG. Also, when I was in Year 6 my teacher introduced me to the first Harry Potter book and I really enjoyed it!

What are you reading at the moment?

The teachers in our school are very good at recommending and lending their books to each other so I often read something from another teacher. During the Year 1 story time I enjoy reading the story 'Stick Man' by Julia Donaldson, with the children.

Why hello, Year 1 and Families! I'm absolutely thrilled that you have picked Once Upon A Raindrop as your book of the month! I do hope you have been enjoying it. It's one of eight books in the 'Once Upon A ..' series. Each book is written in rhyme, and has an illustrator from a different part of the world. I'm based in Wallingford, near Oxford - but the brilliant Nomoco that did the fabulouslywatery illustrations for this book lives in London though comes Japan originally. Everyone at the publisher, Little Tiger Press was overjoyedwith her artwork. Me too! She was the perfect choice of illustrator. In this series I have written about all kinds of things - the story of our sun (Once Upon A Star - the illustrator comes from Spain), the story of music (Once Upon A Rhythm illustrator from Italy), the story of science (Once Upon An Atom illustrator from Brazil), and the story of space travel (The Big Beyond - illustrator from Northern Ireland). Each book takes about three months to write as I need to do lots of research to make sure I get my facts right, and then I begin turning all those facts into a rhyming poem. It's been a real joy to write these books, and they have been translated into various languages from around the world, including Brazilian Portuguese, Italian, German, Korean, Mandarin and Malaysian. In a way, Raindrop took me thirty years to write. My first ever poem for children was written when I training to be an Infant teacher back in 1990. It was about water as that was the class topic! The poem was not good at all. I wrote in a real hurry. Once Upon A Raindrop is like me re-writing that same original poem - the what / why / where / how of water - but many, many years later, and I'm hopefully I've done a better job this time. Happy reading and writing, Year 1!


