Please ensure that you do your research about potential schools by looking at their websites and use all of the choices available. Make sure you have read the admission arrangements fully for the schools you are interested in and know how likely it is that your child will be offered a place there. It is important that you include at least one realistic preference for a school that your child would have met the criteria for in previous years. Please note that some local Catholic schools require you to complete additional information regarding baptismal details. The final date for acceptance of preferences and online applications is 31st October 2021.

#### **Tuck for children in KS2**

Children KS2 may bring a piece of fruit to eat a break time. Children should not be bringing sweets or crisps onto the school site.

Children in KS1 and EYFS will receive a piece of fruit as part of the government 'fruit for schools' scheme.

#### **Asthma and Allergy**

If your child suffers with Asthma or a life-threatening allergy it is vital that school are made aware of this and that there is in date medication in school, clearly labelled with your child's name and dosage. Please note the expiry date of any medication sent in to school so that you can always ensure there is valid indate medication available in the event of an emergency.

#### Nuts

We have a significant number of children in school who have a serious and life-threatening allergy to nuts. No nut based products are used in school and we would please ask parents to ensure that no nut based products are sent in lunchboxes – this includes Nutella sandwich filling. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

#### Values and Virtues

The values and virtues we are focusing on this half term are: Eloquent and Truthful. Pupils are growing to be eloquent and truthful in what they say of themselves, the relations between people, and the world.

#### What does this mean?

Catholic schools help their pupils grow by developing an eloquent language which they can use to understand and articulate their emotions, beliefs, and questions, encouraged by the example of their teachers to be truthful in the way they represent themselves and speak about the world.

#### **Punctuality**

It is important to be on time for school as the first few minutes of the school day are often used to hear readers or organise schoolwork for the rest of the day. Children must attend on time to be given a present mark for the session. If your child misses this short but vital session, their learning may be affected. Late arrivals are disruptive to the whole class and often embarrassing for your child. Arrival after the close of registration may be marked as unauthorised absence in line with the DfE guidance.

Morning registration is at 8.45am. This is the time your child must be in class. The doors open at 8.30am to allow for a prompt start. Lateness is classed as any child coming into school between 8.45am and 8.55am. All children arriving after 8.45am must enter through the KS2 doors and after 8.55am report to the office. Lateness after 8.55am is classed as an unauthorised absence (code U as per DFE compulsory attendance codes).

Lateness is continually monitored. Where children have persistent lateness the Attendance Officer will invite the parents into school for a formal meeting. Should the lateness persist thereafter, further action may be taken which may result in the issue of a penalty notice.

#### **Covid update**

As the number of positive cases of Coronavirus still remains high within Birmingham we would ask that parents continue to wear face coverings when entering the school site and whilst on the playground. Face coverings will be required for any meetings attended in school.

If your child is feeling unwell and you are unsure as to whether to send them to school, as you may think they have Covid, please refer to the following symptoms:

- a high temperature above 37.8c- this means feeling hot to touch on the chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means not being able to smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

Please ensure that you do not send your child to school if they have COVID-19 symptoms. As a precaution, and to ensure the safety of our community, we would strongly advise that families undertake a twice weekly LFD test to check for Covid so that people who are asymptomatic are not unwittingly spreading the virus. Tests are readily available from local pharmacies or can be order online: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests">https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</a> Remember if your child tests positive they will need to isolate for a period of 10 days from the day after symptoms began or the day after the positive test, whichever is earlier.

#### Importance of Reading

Of all the subjects taught in school, reading is first among equals – the most singular in importance because all others rely on it. Excellence in almost any academic subject requires strong reading. People who read lots attain more. They also develop: general knowledge; vocabulary; a better attitude to writing; higher overall attainment; emotional awareness; a wider understanding of the world and greater expression through speech and writing.

There is significant correlation between reading ability and GCSE results across all subjects. Children who are weak readers will struggle as much in Maths and Science at GCSE as they do in English and in Arts subjects.

The consequences of illiteracy are immense:

- · reduced access to higher education;
- more limited job choices;
- on average, lower income;
- higher risk of permanent exclusion;
- poor health;
- poor housing;
- · more likely to have a mental health problem;
- · higher risk of imprisonment;
- shorter life expectancy.

#### **Reading Records**

- Each child has a reading record, which must be signed <u>at least</u> three times a week.
- Children who have their diary signed at least three times per week will be entered into a termly prize draw.
- Teachers will check diaries weekly.
- If a child does not have their diary in school, they will not be able to receive their reading star for that week. Children must collect at least ten stars to enter the prize draw.

# Hearing children read at home

- This should happen for at least fifteen minutes each night.
- Try to make this a special time for you and your child – it should not feel stressful or pressurised for the reader.
- Please focus your attention entirely on your child for this time. Turn off devices and remove other distractions.
- Use strategies such as echo-reading or choral reading to help your child's fluency and expression.
- Even the most confident readers need to be heard reading aloud – encourage older pupils to read a page or two aloud, before then reading independently.

#### Reporting a Pupil Absence

If your child is going to be absent from school you should report the absence by ringing school before 9.00am on the first morning of all absences stating the reason and saying when your child will return. Parents are expected to maintain contact with the school throughout the absence.

In addition to this, we have also added a form on the school website to enable you to report school absence for your child. This form can now be found using the following link:

<u>https://www.stberns.co.uk/pupil-absence</u>. This new method will allow school to have a written record of any absences and hopes to alleviate some of the congestion that occurs on the telephone lines when absences are reported.

**Please note:** If school does not receive a reason for a child's absence then the absence will be recorded as **unauthorised** and appropriate procedures will be followed in line with the school's attendance policy. Furthermore, if your child is attending a medical appointment during the school day please ensure that you present the appointment letter/ card to the office when signing the child in/out so that the reason can be recorded.
