Lockdown

As you are aware the government have announced that England has entered into a second lockdown as of yesterday. Although schools will remain open during this time it will have a profound impact on some school events that were organised this term. Unfortunately, the Confirmation that was planned to take place for Year 6 pupils will no longer go ahead as churches will have to remain closed and we are unable to hold Masses in school. Similarly, the date that had been arranged for Year 4 First Holy Communions will have to be postponed again. We are hoping that we may be able to organise First Confessions for Year 4 to be held in school if restrictions allow. The Year 3 Enrolment Mass at Holy Family on 22nd November will also be cancelled. Further details will follow when new arrangements have been confirmed.

Seesaw

In order to ensure that we can provide effective provision to pupils during isolation, school has invested in new software to support home learning and it is hoped that homework will also be set using this method. We have asked parents to give consent via Parent Pay for this software and then pupils will be given usernames and passwords to enable them to access the information. Please ensure that you have activated your consent on Parent pay. The software is compatible for use on all platforms and will not require parents to have access to other software other than Seesaw which is web based (www.seesaw.me) or available via an app. A guide for parents has been emailed this week.

For every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, your child will earn their class a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours). Winning classes in the school and in the country as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

All game modes (Gig, Garage, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played between 7.30am and 7.30pm on Monday 9th, Tuesday 10th, Wednesday 11th, Thursday 12th, Friday 13th and Saturday 14th.
