What the children will need more than anything is a return to the structure and routine of school. Return to School Arrangements

So from Monday 8th March, **all children** will be returning to school. We will continue to operate the same systems that we did when the children came back in September. This includes operating a one-way system around the school grounds to help minimise the risk of transmission and to aid social distancing during drop off and pick up times. Just to remind you, the entry point for entering the school will be the pedestrian gate closest to the bridge near the KS1 classrooms. The exit gate will be the gate closest to Rohan house nearest to the KS2 playground. This is to avoid any congestion around the Reception/KS1 classrooms where the playground is at its narrowest. This one-way system worked really well when we reopened last September and we are certain it will continue to work with your co-operation. It is also a good way to keep your daily steps up!! Please avoid congregating in groups while waiting to pick up your children. The Nursery entrance at the rear of school will be open but only nursery parents will be able to exit from there at the end of the day.

We expect all parents to continue to wear face coverings when dropping off and picking up children please and there should only be one parent entering the school grounds in order to do this.

If you are picking up from the main office, you will need to exit through the main pedestrian gate at the front of school. If you need to pick up from other doors as well, you will still need to exit from the main pedestrian gate and the re-enter through the entrance gate near the bridge and proceed into the playground. This will allow us to maintain the one-way system around the school.

The school gates will be opened at 8:20 until 8.45am in the morning to allow for a smooth transition of parents through the school grounds. At home time, Nursery through to Year 2 will allow pick-ups to begin from 2.50pm. The school day for the rest of the children will end at 3:00pm as usual from Monday-Thursday and 2:00pm on a Friday.

Safety in and around school

Please be assured that as we did in September, we will continue to provide a safe environment for the children and staff on their return. Everyone in school will be expected to wash and sanitise their hands frequently and surfaces and communal areas will be sprayed and wiped down regularly throughout the day. Break and lunchtimes will also be staggered to allow for children and staff to remain in their year band bubbles at all points throughout the day.

Parents coming into school

We are sad to say that despite the fact that there were a variety of dates when parents were scheduled to come in to school throughout the remainder of this year, unfortunately we do not anticipate that these dates will be able go ahead in the current climate. The exception to this will be the Year 6 Leavers' Mass in July, which usually takes place outside, in the playground and where social distancing measures can be put in place should the need arise.

Self-Isolating Guidelines

Whilst the rate of infection has significantly reduced, there are still as many people in hospital in Birmingham, as there were in the first wave at its peak. Therefore, the following rules still apply. Children should not come into school if:

- They have one or more symptoms of coronavirus
- A member of the household has symptoms of corona virus.
- They have tested positive for corona virus
- They are required to quarantine after visiting a country outside of the common travel area.
- They are extremely, clinically vulnerable in which case they should delay their return to school until after the 31st March.

Tuck

Please note for the remaining weeks of term up until Easter, there will be no tuck or milk available for the children in school. Milk will still be provided for the children aged under 5.

Staff Training Day

Please note that Monday 19th April (immediately after the Easter Holidays) will be a Staff Inset Day. School will reopen for children on Tuesday 20th April.

School Uniform

Please note: Trainers are not allowed. Shoes must be worn to school.

For the remainder of Spring term, the children should continue to wear their Winter uniform, which comprises of a white shirt, school tie, grey jumper or cardigan, grey trousers for boys, grey skirt or pinafore for girls and black shoes. Please ensure that the children return to school in the appropriate uniform on 8th March and that they bring their PE kits back into school with them on that day. PE kit must be kept in school.

Uniform is available from Clive Marks and will not be sold at the school office.

World Book Day

As yesterday was World Book Day, every child will receive a book token next week to be able to exchange for a free WBD book. It would be great if the children are given the opportunity to exchange this token for a book of their choice; the books available suit all ages so there is something for everyone. Many of the books are also available to quiz on Accelerated Reader, our school reading programme, so there's even more reason to get swapping! Here are all the books on offer this year:



Free School Meals

Parents/carers of children entitled to Free School Meals should have received their final vouchers this week. These amount to £30 per child from Reception to Year 6 and £20 per child per Nursery child. Vouchers cover the 2 week period between 22nd February to 5th March.

Secondary School Offer

By now, all year 6 children will have received confirmation of their secondary school place for September. If you have not yet received your offer, please contact School Admissions by telephone 0121 303 1888 or by email, admissions@birmingham.gov.uk.

Next steps

- The email and letter you receive will name the secondary school your child has been offered for September 2021. You will only need to inform Birmingham City Council by 15th March 2021 if you are refusing this offer. Details of how to do this will be included in your offer letter.
- If you do not contact School Admissions at Birmingham City Council to refuse the offer, the Secondary school will update their records to show the offer has been accepted.
- If your child has not been offered a place at any of the schools you applied for, this will be because the school(s) received more applications than there were places available and other children met the admission criteria more closely than your child.
- You are strongly encouraged not to refuse the offer, so that your child has a guaranteed place for September 2021. By refusing the offer, the place may be given to a child on the waiting list for that school.
- The offer being accepted will not affect your child's waiting list position for any of your higher preference schools or influence the outcome of any appeal you may submit.

Online homework is the norm in many schools across the country and now that we have set it up, we will be continuing to use this platform to provide homework for our children.

It was lovely to see so many of you attend your 'catch-up' meetings with your class teachers and classmates this week. We hope you enjoyed seeing everyone again. There are just a few days now until we are all back together in school. We cannot wait to see you all dressed smartly in your school uniform, PE bags and reading books in hand, ready to carry on with your learning. All of your teachers have missed you and we look forward to welcoming you back on Monday morning. Make sure you get everything you need for school the day before, so that you don't forget anything on Monday morning.

Miss Corkery and Mrs Colclough would like to thank Aisha for being so hard working, friendly and well mannered. She has been a pleasure to have in school.


Year 5

Dear parent/carer,

I look forward to welcoming all children back to school on Monday 8th March, from this date attendance will be mandatory and school will have the ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices. The only children who will be unable to attend are those who have symptoms of corona virus or have a positive test result, those living with someone with symptoms or a positive test, and those children who are confirmed as clinically extremely vulnerable. Children can return to school, ten days after isolation, if they have tested positive.

I understand that some parents may be anxious about the children returning to school, however a number of controls are in place, to minimise the risk of infection and to ensure we have as safe an environment as possible for both pupils and staff to work in.

The following controls will be in place from Monday 8th March and will continue until the end of the academic year.

PARENTS

- A staggered start will continue to allow parents flexibility at drop off times.
 The gates will open at 8.15 am and will be locked promptly at 8.45 am.
 Drop off between these times will hopefully reduce the number of parents on the premises at any one time. Parents of children in Nursery, Reception and KS1 can collect between 2.50 pm and 3.00 pm. Parents MUST NOT gather at the gates or come onto the site without an appointment.
- 2. A one-way system will be in operation for parents who are dropping off their children to school. Parents should enter via the Hobmoor Road entrance side gate (beside the park) and walk around the school building exiting via the vehicular entrance on Hobmoor Road. Alternatively, you can enter through the nursery gate but only PARENTS OF NURSERY CHILDREN WILL BE ABLE TO EXIT VIA the NURSERY.
- 3. All parents must wear a face mask when on the school premises (unless exempt).
- 4. Parents should contact the school office by telephone 0121 783 7232 or email enquiry@stberns.bham.sch.uk if they have any queries, they should not enter the school building.



- 5. If any child develops a new and continuous cough or a high temperature whilst in school, they will be sent home immediately and will be advised to get a test.
- Where families have travelled from or through a 'red list' country in the previous 10 days, they must quarantine in a managed quarantine hotel for 10 days.

CHILDREN

We will do everything in our power to reduce the risk of transmission by limiting the number of pupils and staff in contact with each other, to only those within the group. Maintaining distinct groups that do not mix makes it quicker and easier in the event of a positive case to identify those who need, to self-isolate. We are very aware that children have missed a significant amount of time in school this year and want to avoid, wherever possible, having to send children home. Therefore, the following measures will be in place within the classroom:

- 1. Where possible, staff will maintain a safe distance from the children and will continue to self-test twice weekly.
- 2. Children will have a stationery set of their own, which will contain their pencils, pens, rulers etc. This equipment will not be shared.
- 3. Resources that are shared between classes such as sports and science equipment will be cleaned frequently.
- 4. Pupils are asked to limit the amount of equipment they bring into school to essentials such as hats coats, lunchboxes, reading books. Bags are allowed, to minimise infection.
- 5. All children will be required to wash their hands when entering school. Frequent handwashing will continue throughout the day.
- 6. Classrooms will be well ventilated. Windows will be open. Please ensure that your child has their school jumper/sweatshirt every day.
- 7. Staff will be required to wear facemasks/visors when moving around the school. They will not be obligatory in classrooms.
- Enhanced cleaning in school will continue. Desks will be cleaned every time children move into a different classroom. Frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned more often than normal and toilets will be cleaned regularly.

- 9. Pupils will be positioned, back to back or side to side in class whenever it is practical to do this. This will apply to children in KS2 and some in KS1.
- 10. Year band bubbles will be maintained. Children will not mix with other children from different year bands. Break times and lunch times will be staggered and assemblies will be held in year bands and not key stages.
